GUIDELINES FOR FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE:

- **Daybreak will give a one-time donation to those who are not associated with the local assembly of Daybreak. This donation is not to exceed \$200. No other financial help is available unless the person receiving help begins to attend church services and pursues the values and "Directions" of Daybreak Community Church.**
- Daybreak will give a one-time donation, per year, with a maximum additional two donations (not to exceed \$300 annually) to those who are associated with the local assembly.
- It is Daybreaks' first desire to give specific help for a specific need. For instance we seek to pay a rent bill directly to the apartment complex or gas company, before writing a general check to the person asking for assistance.
- Exceptional circumstances will be considered on a case by case basis by the Lead Pastor.
- The North County Food Bank is available for anyone who is in need.

GUIDELINES FOR MEMBERS OF DAYBREAK (pertaining to financial counseling):

- A pastoral counseling session is required before any financial assistance is given.
- Person must be participating in the "Directions" of Daybreak Community Church
- There is a \$400 cap every 24 month, and assumes the counselee will contribute to the cost.
- Financial need must be established prior to providing benefit and will be determined by the pastoral staff.

LIVING COMMUNITY

LIVING MERCY
